Shabbat Chol HaMoed – Sukkot

TORAH PORTION

Chol HaMoed

PAGE: 362 (12)

Chol HaMoed, a Hebrew phrase meaning "weekdays of the festival", refers to the intermediate days of Passover and Sukkot. As the name implies, these days mix features of "chol" (weekday or secular) and "moed" (festival). On Sukkot, Chol HaMoed consists of the second through seventh days (third through seventh in the Diaspora). Although it has a unique name, Hoshanah Rabbah, the seventh day of Sukkot, is part of Chol HaMoed. Prayer services that day combine some usual practices of Chol HaMoed with practices of both Yom Tov and the High Holy Days.

Hoshanah Rabbah: The seventh day of the Jewish holiday of Sukkot, 21st day of Tishrei, is known as Hoshana Rabbah. This day is marked by a special synagogue service, the Hoshana Rabbah, in which seven circuits are made by the worshippers with their lulav and etrog, while the congregation recites Hoshanot. It is customary for the scrolls of the Torah to be removed from the ark during this procession. In a few communities a shofar is sounded after each circuit.

In order to attend Simchat Torah:

- You must RSVP as soon as possible, by emailing: windsorabb@gmail.com or call 519-256-2572.
- Please specify how many family members will be attending. If you are not coming with a family, who is in your bubble that you can sit with.
- If you are coming alone, there will be seating for you as well.
- All the tables will be clearly marked with names.
- Unfortunately, no one will be allowed into the building unless you have RSVP'd (We must comply with the Health Unit).
- Masks must be worn once entering the building and in all common areas; your mask may be removed when you are seated in your assigned-reserved table in the social hall to eat.
- There will be a Deli Dinner, snacks and L'Chaim to enjoy.
- The dinner (Kiddush) is being sponsored by Rabbi Sholom and Rivka Galperin in honour of our daughter, Shaina.
- Dancing will only take place in your area where your table is and you may dance in your spot.
- Once we have reached our maximum capacity, we will not be able to take anymore RSVP's, so it will be on a first-come, first-serve basis.

Starting at 7:45 PM: We will have a small service and the Torah going around the Bima for the 7 Hakafot (circles) upstairs in the main sanctuary, socially-distanced. Afterwards, we will then go down to the social hall for dinner. There will be goodie bags for the kids, as well as hand-held streamers.
