Parshas Hol Hamoed

Chol Hamoed (literally, "the weekday of the holiday") refers to the "intermediate period" of the festival of Sukkot. As the name implies, these days mix features of "chol" (weekday or secular) and "moed" (festival). They are the days sandwiched between the beginning and ending holy days of both festivals.

Sukkot through Simchat Torah is nine days long. The first two days (Sukkot) and the last two days (Shemini Atzeret and Simchat Torah) are full-fledged festival days, and the middle five days are Chol Hamoed. (In Israel, the holiday is eight days long—Shemini Atzeret and Simchat Torah being condensed into one day—with the middle six days being Chol Hamoed.) Simchat Torah, "Rejoicing of/[with the] Torah" is a Jewish holiday that celebrates and marks the conclusion of the annual cycle of public Torah readings, and the beginning of a new cycle. Simchat Torah is a component of the Biblical Jewish holiday of Shemini Atzeret, which follows immediately after the festival of Sukkot in the month of Tishrei.

The main celebration of Simchat Torah takes place in the synagogue during evening and morning services. In Orthodox as well as many Conservative congregations, this is the only time of year on which the Torah scrolls are taken out of the ark and read at night. In the morning, the last parashah of Deuteronomy and the first parashah of Genesis are read in the synagogue.

The morning service is also uniquely characterized by the calling up of each male member for an aliyah. There is also a special aliyah for all the children (under 13 or 12 for boys and girls). Erev Simchat Torah is this Monday evening.
