February 2023

The Chevra Kadisha 'Burial Society' is a volunteer group of Jewish men and women who see to it that the bodies of deceased Jews are prepared for burial according to Jewish tradition and are protected from desecration, willful or not, until burial. Their job is to ensure dignified treatment of the deceased in accordance with Jewish law, custom and tradition. Men prepare the bodies of men, women prepare those of women.

Participation in the Chevra Kadisha (literally, "holy society") is seen as one of the most important Mitzvot (good deeds) you can do, as the deceased person cannot thank or repay you for the help you gave them. Jewish tradition regards it as exceptionally meritorious to join a chevra kadisha. In the not so distant past, people actually bid and paid for the opportunity to participate, it is such a lofty Mitzvah. The T'hara has many components; some do not involve actual contact with the deceased. Everybody can play a useful role as a member of the Chevra Kadisha.

We here in the Windsor Jewish community have counted on a few individuals who have performed these Mitzvot for many years.

But our numbers have dwindled. We need a few more individuals, men and women, willing to assist and perform these mitzvot. If you are at all interested, please contact the Shaar office, or one of the funeral directors, who will share more details, answer any questions, or arrange for you to observe and/or assist, to see if it is something you could do to help the community and those who grieve.

When the Torah reading is completed, prayers are offered for those seeking recovery from illness (*mischeberach*). The congregants tell the *Gabbai* the sick person's name and mother's name, preferably in Hebrew, i.e., Rivka bat Sara.

An interesting item to note: Prayers for the sick reference the sick person's mother's name and prayers for someone who is receiving an *aliyah* reference the person's father's name. According to Jewish law, a father's name is like a surname, used only for the purpose of identification. A mother, however, is associated with life and the soul.
