TORAH READING: Rosh Hashanah – First Day PAGE 402

The Torah portion for this day, tells of the birth of Isaac to Abraham and Sarah. Now that they have a child of their own they ought to be quite happy, but their happiness is disturbed. Ishmael, who had been born to Hagar, is a wild fellow and Sarah is troubled by Ishmael's bad influence on the younger Isaac. Sarah urges Abraham to send Hagar and Ishmael away. Abraham is reluctant to follow Sarah's suggestion for he loves his son, Ishmael, too. But G-d assures Abraham that it would be better for all if Hagar and Ishmael were to move away. Nor should Abraham worry about Hagar and Ishmael. They would be cared for and Ishmael's descendants would be a great people in the future.

This Torah reading is one of the many examples in the Bible of G-d 'remembering.' He remembers and fulfills the promise of a child to Abraham and Sarah. One of the important themes of Rosh Hashanah is that of *Zichronot*, G-d remembering.

HAFTORAH READING: Rosh Hashanah – First Day PAGE 416

The *Haftorah* tells of the birth of a child to Hannah and Elkanah. Like Abraham and Sarah, this couple has been childless for a long time. Hannah prays with all her heart to G-d, and promises that if she and her husband should yet be blessed with a son, he would be dedicated from birth to G-d's service. At last, Hannah's prayer is fulfilled and Samuel is born. Hannah carries out her promise and Samuel is dedicated to G-d.

TORAH READING:

Rosh Hashanah – Second Day

PAGE 402

The torah reading for the second day of Rosh Hashanah tells of the very difficult test to which Abraham was put by G-d. Abraham is asked to offer up his beloved son, Isaac, as a sacrifice. Abraham is prepared to carry out this most difficult challenge of his life. But at the last moment, as Isaac lies bound on the alter at the top of Mt. Moriah, G-d makes it known to Abraham, that He does not want human sacrifice, and Isaac lives. Here, then, at the beginnings of Judaism, it is made clear that our faith is to be different from the ancient religions of which human sacrifices were a natural part.

The prophet Jeremiah, who lived to see the destruction of the First Temple and the exile of his people, brings to them a message of hope for the future. Jeremiah urges that the exiles repent of their wrongdoings and return to a full faith in G-d. He, in turn, will restore them to their land and they shall live in peace once more.

One of the important themes of Rosh Hashanah is *Jehovah*, repentance of wrong and a return to right. The *Haftorah* emphasizes this theme.
